GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE U OF A BED (ELEMENTARY) MIDDLE YEARS TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM:

- In the fall of 1996, Red Deer College began a collaborative Bachelor of Education degree program with the University of Alberta. This has given many university graduates an opportunity to receive a Bachelor of Education Degree at Red Deer College, which focuses on teaching young adolescents from grades 4 through 9. The program is available to students who have completed either the first two years of the B.Ed. Elementary program or an approved degree.
- This degree consists of a total of 120 credits (40 half year courses), of which 60 credits (20 half year courses) are completed as a U of A student. Year 3 and 4 of this program are completed on Red Deer College campus as a University of Alberta student. Each year 40 students are selected on a competitive basis for admission to the program. Students admitted progress through this program with a cohort of students enabling participation in a cooperative learning environment.
- Students are admitted through the University of Alberta to Year 3 of the program after successful completion of 60 units of course weight transferable and applicable to the B.Ed. Elementary degree as outlined in this guide, or they are admitted after completion of an approved degree. All applicants must complete pre-professional studies prior to admission.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS WHICH CAN BE COMPLETED AT RDC:

Non-Education Elements: courses from the fine arts, humanities, sciences, social sciences and physical education, in which students get some background in all required elementary school subjects.

Computing Requirement: can be any computing course which transfers to the U of A. However an instructional technology course is recommended.

Education Core I: comprised of two education courses which give students background in topics in the education of children.

Education Option: any course which transfers as a course offered by the Faculty of Education at the U of A.

Non-Education Options: courses which transfer as courses other than those offered by the Faculty of Education at the U of A. These include courses from the following areas: business, arts & science, physical education. Options give you an opportunity to sample courses in an area of interest or subject area you would like to know more about. It is a chance to expand your mind and learn something new.

Open Option: any transferable course from the above selection of non-education options, as well as any course which transfers as a course offered by the Faculty of Education at the U of A.

NOTES:

- 1. Transferable Course:** Check the Alberta Transfer Guide (<http://www.acat.gov.ab.ca>) to ensure that each course you choose is transferable to the U of A. This guide also tells you:
 - Whether a course transfers to an equivalent course at U of A, or whether it transfers as an "unspecified" course (where U of A does not offer a course that exactly maps on to the RDC course);
 - How many transfer credits you will receive [usually 6 (a full-year course) **or** 3 (a one-semester course) **or** 1.5 (many physical activity/dance (KPAC/KDNC) and music ensemble (MUSE) courses transfer as 1.5 credits and you need two of these to equal a 3-credit course)];
 - Level of credit to be awarded (junior-level courses are RDC courses that transfer as **100-level** courses to the U of A; senior-level courses are RDC courses that transfer as **200-level** (or higher) courses to the U of A).
- 2. Senior Level Courses (Senior):** You must have at least 12 transfer credits (4 half courses) from Non-Education Elements, Non-Education Options which are at the senior level (transfer as U of A **200-level** or higher) to meet admission requirements of your degree program.
- 3. MATH 260:** The prerequisite to MATH 260 is Math 30 (Pure). If you have not completed this prerequisite course, you will need to discuss this with an Academic Advisor.

COURSES AVAILABLE AT RDC FOR ALTERNATE MINORS:

Due to the competitiveness of the Middle Years program, it is recommended that you try to include at least 3-6 transfer credits from an alternate Elementary Route Minor as Non-Education Options. This would be required if you are unable to gain admission to Year 3 of the Middle Years program at RDC and decide to transfer to U of A main campus to complete the BEd Elementary program.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION MINOR (UP TO 9 CREDITS)

- Some of the above courses have prerequisites. Students may wish to take prerequisite courses as Non-Ed Options or Elements in Year 1 in order to take the desired MINOR course(s) in Year 2.
- Minimum of 6 credits must be at the senior level (transfer to the U of A as 200-level or higher).
- Since Early Childhood Education is a 21 credit (rather than an 18 credit) Minor, students must leave a Non-Ed Option free in order to take other Early Childhood requirements at U of A.

Mathematics/Science Minors must leave a Non-Ed Option free in order to take the required Language and Literacy course at U of A.

¹In order to register in MUSI 257 students must successfully complete a Theory Placement Exam or equivalent. Please contact the RDC Music department as soon as possible for further information.

NOTE:

- MUSI 257/258 & 259/260 are recommended in Year 1 to prevent scheduling difficulties in later years.
- Music Minors must leave a Non-Ed Option free in order to take the required Language and Literacy course at U of A.
- Since Music is a 21 credit (rather than an 18 credit) Minor, students must leave a Non-Ed Option free in order to take other Music requirements at U of A.

NATIVE EDUCATION MINOR (UP TO 9 CREDITS)

Up to 9 credits from:

¹Some of the above courses have prerequisite(s). Students may wish to take prerequisite courses as Non-Ed Options or ELEMENTS in Year 1 in order to take the desired MINOR course(s) in Year 2.

Minimum of 6 credits must be senior level (transfer to U of A as 200-level or higher).

PHYSICAL EDUCATION MINOR (UP TO 12 CREDITS)

² Check the Alberta Transfer Guide regarding transfer credits for these courses. Some KPACs transfer for 1.5 credits each (in which case two courses must be taken to achieve 3 transfer credits).

Physical Education Minors must leave a Non-Ed Option free in order to take the required Language and Literacy course at U of A.

SECOND LANGUAGES - FRENCH MINOR (UP TO 12 CREDITS) TRANSFER AFTER ONE YEAR RECOMMENDED

NOTE:

- Students who have not taken French 30 are required to take FREN 101/102 as preparation for further French studies. However, these courses are not applicable to the French minor requirements at the U of A and must be taken as a Non-Ed OPTION. **Student will not receive credit if French 30 has been taken.**
- Because Second Languages is a 21 credit (rather than an 18 credit) Minor, students must leave a Non-Ed Option free in order to take other Second Language requirements at U of A.
- Students with advanced language proficiency (e.g. FREN 30N, IB French, etc.) should consult with an advisor regarding applying for Advanced Standing.

SECOND LANGUAGES - SPANISH MINOR (UP TO 12 CREDITS) TRANSFER AFTER ONE YEAR RECOMMENDED

- Minimum of 6 credits must be senior level (transfer to U of A as 200-level or higher).
- Social Studies Minors must leave a Non-Ed Option free in order to take the required Language and Literacy course at U of A.

SPECIAL EDUCATION MINOR (UP TO 6 CREDITS) TRANSFER AFTER ONE YEAR RECOMMENDED

NOTE:

- Some of the above courses have prerequisites. Students may wish to take prerequisite courses as Non-Ed Options or ELEMENTS in Year 1 in order to take the desired MINOR course(s) in Yr 2.

VISUAL STUDIES (UP TO 15 CREDITS) TRANSFER AFTER ONE YEAR RECOMMENDED

Up to 3 credits from Senior transferable ART

NOTE:

- Minimum of 6 credits must be senior level (transfer to U of A as 200-level or higher).
- Visual Studies Minors must leave a Non-Ed Option free in order to take the required Language and Literacy course at U of A.
- Because Visual Studies is a 21 credit (rather than an 18 credit) Minor, students must leave one Non-Ed Option free in order to take other Visual Studies requirements at U of A.

UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA ADMISSIONS AND TRANSFER INFORMATION FOR BACHELOR OF EDUCATION, ELEMENTARY MIDDLE YEARS MINOR

1. **Minimum Grade:** The minimum transferable grade to the University of Alberta is C-.
2. **Minimum Admission Requirements:** Students will be considered for admission to Year 3 of the Bachelor of Education Elementary – Middle Years program (U of A at RDC) only after they have completed the 60 applicable transfer credits as outlined on page two. Students must also have achieved a minimum admission grade point average (AGPA) of 2.0 on the 4-point scale in order to apply. **The actual average needed for admission may be higher.**
3. **After Degree Applicants:** Students who have completed another degree may apply to Year 3 as long as their previous study includes:
 - a) at least 3 half courses from three of the following six Elements: mathematics, social science, natural science, fine arts, physical education, and health;
 - b) a half course in computing (instructional technology); and
 - c) two half courses or one full course in English language/literature.

Students who have a previous degree must have an evaluation done by the University of Alberta to determine what requirements (if any) still need to be completed (refer to Appendix A for details).

4. **Residency Requirement:** No more than 60 credits may be transferred to the U of A and applied towards a BEd degree.
5. **Admission Grade Point Average (AGPA):** The AGPA for Year 3 is calculated on all transferable courses completed in the most recent two semesters of study, as long as these two terms contain 24 credits of transferable course work or more. If the most recent two semesters contain less than 24 credits of transferable course work, all the work in the next most recent semester(s) of study is included until a minimum of 24 credits have been achieved.

NOTE:

Transferable courses/course work means any course that is transferable to the U of A and in which you have received a grade, even if the grade you received is not transferable (i.e. "D+" or lower).

6. **Application Information:** Apply to the University of Alberta for Year 3 (according to U of A admission procedures and deadlines). Indicate Red Deer College on the application form where applicable to confirm that you are applying to a collaborative off-campus program. You should also indicate a second preference by selecting an alternate minor if you wish to be considered for the program in Edmonton in case you are not accepted to the U of A/RDC Collaborative Middle Years program.

NOTE:

U of A advises students who have an AGPA lower than 3.2 to apply to a second choice program. Students can indicate this on one application form or they can submit two separate application forms. Submitting two separate applications will cost students a little more money but they will be able to register in courses and have themselves completely set up for their second choice program. If they get into the Middle Years program they can easily drop themselves out of their main campus courses. If they do not get into the Middle Years program they will be set for their second choice program.

Admission to the BEd program at U of A occurs in September only.

7. **Application Deadlines:** The application deadline is May 1. The document deadline is June 15. Although the deadline for application to this program is May 1, students are advised to apply as early as possible.

9. **Early Admission:** This information pertains to alternate minors (U of A main campus) only. Please note that there is no Early Admission to the Collaborative Middle Years minor program.
- Students are encouraged to submit one unofficial RDC transcript to U of A as soon as final grades for fall term are available so that they can be considered for early admission. This should happen automatically through Apply Alberta. Check your "To Do" list on BearTracks to confirm.
 - Early admission is based on fall grades of the current term as long as the fall term contains a minimum of 9 credits (with final grades at the end of fall term) and the subsequent winter term contains sufficient number of credits to equal to 24 in the fall/winter terms.
 - If there are less than 9 credits (with final grades at the end of fall term) or there are less than 24 credits in the current fall/winter terms, the process will be to go back to previous term(s) and use all courses from the terms that the final 24 credits span. (e.g. If student has two 3-credit courses completed in fall term, but the third course is a full-year course U of A will go back to previous term(s) to determine early admission.)

Students are encouraged to submit two official transcripts to U of A as soon as grades are available for winter term. This should happen automatically through Apply Alberta. Final admission will be offered on the condition that the GPA for winter term is equal to or greater than the conditional AGPA.

10. **Year of Program:** For students not admitted to Year 3 of the Collaborative BEd Elementary Route Middle Years minor, the year of the program to which a transfer applicant is admitted at U of A depends on the number of transferable credits that are applicable to the BEd program for which they have applied:

TO APPLY TO:

Year 1: The U of A Faculty of Education requires a year of pre-professional study. This means that if you will be applying to the U of A with less than 24 transfer credits, you have to apply to a faculty other than Education.

Year 2: Need 24 or more (but less than 60) applicable transfer credits.

NOTE:

Students applying to Year 2 at U of A with more than 45 transfer credits may encounter scheduling difficulties if they have not completed EDPY 200.

Year 3: Need 60 applicable transfer credits.

NOTE:

Students applying to Year 3 at U of A may encounter scheduling difficulties if they have not completed EDPY 200, EDIT 302 and all of their required ELEMENTS (24 credits).

11. **Repetition of Courses:** If a course with a grade of C- or above is repeated, the second attempt will not be used in calculating the AGPA for U of A.
12. **Required to Withdraw Applicants:** Applicants who have been twice required to withdraw from any post secondary program(s) or institution(s) should contact U of A Faculty of Education Undergraduate Student Services for information.
13. **Spring Courses:** The U of A advises that students who take courses at RDC in the Spring (May-June) semester which immediately precedes admission to the U of A will be disadvantaged. This is because applicants registered in the Spring semester are placed "on hold" until final transcripts arrive and admission will not be considered for students whose final transcripts do not arrive by the June 15 document deadline (RDC Spring semester does not end until the end of June).
14. **Regarding transfer to the University of Alberta & Augustana Faculty:** When checking course transfer to the University of Alberta, please note that courses which have "AU" as the first two letters of the course abbreviation in the Alberta Transfer Guide will transfer only to the U of A Augustana Faculty in Camrose. In order for a course to also transfer to other U of A faculties, there must be another entry indicating transfer as a course not beginning with "AU". See example below.

CMPT 214= U of A CMPUT 114 (3) OR AUCSC 1xx (3)

CMPT 261= U of A AUCSC 1xx (3)

CMPT 214 is transferable to all U of A faculties, including Augustana, whereas CMPT 261 is accepted only by Augustana Faculty and will not transfer to other faculties at the U of A in Edmonton.

The function of academic advisors is to provide students with information and resources that enable them to make informed decisions relevant to their education. These resources include the Red Deer College Calendar, the Academic Planning Guide for your chosen program and destination university (if applicable), the Alberta Transfer Guide and the calendar and contact information for your destination university (if applicable). Academic advisors will assist you in interpreting information from these resources or refer you to your destination university if appropriate. Students in university transfer programs are strongly advised to refer to the calendar of the university to which they wish to transfer and should contact appropriate university departments as required.

APPENDIX A

EVALUATION OF POST-SECONDARY COURSES BY THE FACULTY OF EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA

Since the BEd Middle Years program is a University of Alberta degree program, it is the staff at the U of A who will be evaluating your previous post-secondary education and determining what credit (if any) will be awarded for that work. It is also this staff who will be making all admissions decisions regarding admission to year three of the Middle Years program.

It is often difficult for students with post-secondary education from other institutions to ensure that Red Deer College courses they choose will complete the specific requirements for the first two years of this program. The U of A has provided an opportunity to these students so that they will know before the end of the fall term what transfer credit (if any) they have been granted by the U of A. This will allow students to make adjustments to their winter schedules at RDC as required.

In order to have this evaluation done, the U of A has indicated that you must do the following:

1. Apply to the U of A for admission.
2. Pay the required application fee.
3. Have two official transcripts submitted to the U of A from all post-secondary institutions attended.
4. Submit one unofficial Red Deer College transcript (or if you are currently attending an institution other than RDC have an unofficial transcript sent from that institution).
5. FOLLOW UP with Liyan Derman (liyan.derman@ualberta.ca)*, U of A Faculty of Education to request a “preliminary evaluation” of coursework. In order to have a preliminary evaluation done, the U of A has indicated that you must contact the U of A advisor that facilitates admissions to the RDC Collaborative Middle Years minor program.
